Predict the impact the current pandemic may have on religious beliefs and organisations in the future.            Research the impact of Globalisation on religion in Britain – consider technology, travel and immigration. Look up Lyon’s study ‘Jesus in Disneyland’ to help understand religion today.            Research the levels of religiosity in other countries <i>eg</i> Latin America, Poland, USA and draw conclusions with the UK.            Consider, is Britain alone or are other countries following suit?</p>

List the main reasons for the rise in the last 40 years.</p>	<p>Watch the Louis Theroux documentary ‘My Scientology Movie’.            Watch ‘The most hated family in America’ – list the characteristics of these organisations that make them cult-like.            Research the Kendal Project (Heelas and Woodhead):            Follow <b>Link 1</b> (below)            Identify any evidence found in the Kendal project to support the claim of a ‘spiritual revolution’.</p>	<p>Read the BBC article ‘Tomorrow’s Gods: What is the future of religion?’ Draw your own conclusions – is religion completely dead? Is it declining or is it being revitalised. Explain your reasons.            Debate the view that the rise in sects and cults and New Age movements is a sign of secularisation – make a list of reasons for and against.</p>
<p><b>Topic: Mass Media and Crime</b>            Research the work of Stan Cohen: Folk devils and moral panics-Watch the news report on Mods and Rockers in the 1960s. Summarise Cohen’s view on the impact of social media.</p>	<p>Research the London riots of August 2011.
